

Instructions to Register with the FAA as a Recreational Flyer

NOTE: Every RC pilot 13 years of age or older, must register with the FAA.

When you open the link, do not be concerned that it appears you are registering to fly Drones. The FAA considers any un-manned aircraft controlled by Radio Control is called a "Drone."

On the web page, you will see: **"I fly under The Exception for Recreation Flyers"**, in the oval block, click on: **"Register"**

Fill in the requested information. Be sure to remember your password and the e-mail address you used. You will need this whenever you want to log into your FAA account.

Next, enter your name and address, and a credit card number, the cost is \$5.00 for three years.

After everything is set up, you will be able to see your registration card information each time you log into the FAA website.

Print that page, and cut-out your registration card. It must be on your person at all times when you're flying.

A copy of your FAA registration must be sent with the 107th application when you join the 107th RC Flyers Club, and when you renew your membership to the club.

The unique FAA registration number assigned to you must be clearly marked on any outside surface of each RC aircraft you are flying. This same FAA number will be used on every aircraft you fly.

Presently, there is no requirement for the font size or color, as long it's readable.

NOTE: The AMA advises that your contact information be placed inside your aircraft in case it gets lost someone will be able to contact you.
